### Forty Years After *In re Gault*: Do Kangaroo Courts Still Rule?

---

On May 15, 1967, the United States Supreme Court decided the landmark case *In re Gault*. Much like the Miranda decision that preceded it, *In re Gault* sent shockwaves across the legal landscape. The decision forced the states to undertake a fundamental reexamination of the operation of their juvenile justice systems. The Court's goal was to ensure that states granted the same fundamental due process rights to children that were accorded to adult defendants. The question that faces us today is to what extent the implementation of the rulings of *In re Gault* has resulted in significant advancements being made in this vitally important area of the law.

In honor of the upcoming 40th anniversary of the decision, the Barry Law Review is issuing a call for papers to ascertain how much progress has been made in achieving the goals of the specific rulings of *Gault*: affording children a right to notice, right to counsel, right against compelled self-incrimination, right to confrontation, and right to an appeal. The Law Review will welcome papers which evaluate the advancements that have or have not been made in one or more of these important areas of children's rights, discusses changes that still need to be implemented in the juvenile justice system to achieve the goals of *Gault*, or which sheds a new light or brings a new perspective to one or more of the rulings emanating from *In re Gault*.

The submission deadline for articles is on or before on June 15th, 2007. Please submit proposals as soon as possible. Article slots will be filled as proposals for articles are accepted.

There is no limit on length of the articles and citations should comply with the latest edition of the Bluebook. Please prepare manuscripts in Microsoft Word 2000 or a later version. Selected manuscripts will be published in Volume 9 of the Barry Law Review, scheduled for publication in Fall of 2007, as a symposium issue dedicated to *In re Gault*.
